








The Lone Star Chorale has a repertoire that covers everything from originals and traditional cowboy songs to western swing and contemporary songs by some of today's finest western songwriters. Strong lead vocals, plenty of three-part harmony and expert instrumentation are the solid foundation of this Texas group, featuring Jill Jones, Lynn Daniel, and Doug Floyd.

Serenata Mexicana is a group that bridges the historical and musical gap between the American Cowboy and the Mexican Vaquero, cultural ancestor of the western cowboy tradition. Christina Ortega and John Cazares together explore and share the musical roots of "Mexico lindo y querido" (beautiful, beloved Mexico) in performances that have been well received at numerous festivals and Cowboy Poetry Gatherings throughout the Southwest.
